## Journeyman Plumber

Journeyman Plumbers performs skilled technical work in the installation, repair, replacement, and maintenance of domestic water systems, sanitary sewer systems, grease waste & oil waste systems, storm sewers, fuel gas pipe, medical gas, compressed air and condensate pipes.

A successful plumber must have a thorough knowledge of hydraulic systems, be patient individuals with a practical mind and manual dexterity, and able to work efficiently with great attention to detail. We are fortunate enough at Matthews Plumbing to own most of the equipment that we use throughout projects. This equipment is the responsibility of the Journeymen in the field, so some mechanical knowledge is appreciated. Small amounts of daily maintenance are required when operating this machinery.

### Responsibilities

- Reading and understanding blueprints and drawings to understand or plan the layout of all plumbing systems defined in the scope of work. These may include sanitary waste, grease waste, oil waste, acid waste, domestic water, storm water, medical gas, natural gas, compressed air.
- Measuring, cutting, assembling and installing pipes and tubes while paying attention to other infrastructure on the project (i.e. mechanical duct, fire protection, electrical and low voltage wiring).
- Repair or replace broken drainage lines, clogged drains, faucets, etc.
- Teaching, guiding, and instructing plumbing apprentices under your direct supervision.
- Always maintain superior levels of job cleanliness and project safety.
- Observe pressure gauges to fix leaks.
- Ensure all installations, repairs and maintenance are properly sized, aligned, supported and grade.
- Test pipe systems and fix leaks.

### Requirements

- Solid understanding of water distribution, disposal systems, natural gas delivery & compressed air systems in residential, commercial, and industrial buildings.
- Ability to handle plumbing tools and equipment (pipe wrenches, pipe cutters, acetylene torch, etc.).
- Good communication and interpersonal skills.
- Friendly and patient.
- Good physical condition and strength with the ability to work in awkward locations.
- Valid license to practice profession.
- Must be able to lift and carry materials and equipment weighing up to 50 pounds on a frequent basis and up to 100 pounds on an occasional basis.
- Prolonged standing and frequent bending, stooping, and reaching daily.
- Requires a full range of physical motion to operate manual and electrically powered tools and plumbing equipment.
